After the orientation we had 51 people stay for the meeting - a record. The meeting was opened with a motion to say the Pledge of Allegiance. A lot of business was conducted:



A motion was made, discussed, and passed to put off the fundraiser banquet for this year, mainly due to being so short on time to get it organized. The raffle will still happen with the drawing on Feb. 23rd. Buy tickets. Also, the 50/50 pot is over \$300 and will be drawn the same time. Your name is entered each time you attend a meeting.

Steve went over the proposed minor changes to the By Laws and they will be voted on at the Feb. meeting.

Acting Treasurer Cindy got the scholarship check to last year's winner, Tori Kretschman.

A discussion was started on the purchase of a laptop. This was tabled until the Board meeting while research is done on brands, software programs, a printer, and who should use it.



Regarding the dues increase, the Board is working on a budget for the new year. Holly Conti and new Treasurer Ron Tidd will help with this effort. Last year we spent over \$10,000 on annual costs such as property tax, liability insurance, non-profit fee, gambling license, porta-potty, and many other items, not including postage, admin supplies, fishing derby prizes, banquet prizes and other costs like advertising and thank you ads. With plans to build a trap/skeet range, finish the meeting room, expand the pistol range, and develop a shooting area down at the lower piece below the wind turbine, general maintenance and painting, we will definitely be in need of funds. It's very expensive to operate this shooting range and manage over 700 members.
