There has been discussion on shooting ground targets. Range Master has decided to allow ground targets on the shotgun range only where they would simulate a running rabbit. There is no retrieving these targets, no walking out past the firing line. **For shotguns only!!**

The Board has decided to allow targets with human features and zombies.

The Law Enforcement Range is not open for general use due to it not being developed and is not safe with the 400 yard targets open for shooting. A motion was passed at the last meeting to allow some "hosted" shoots at the LE Range. They will be attended by an RSO and the 400 yard targets will be closed during that function. No final decision has been made on what to do in the future with this LE Range area, except possibly change the name.
